Albright College is fully accredited by the Commission on Higher Education of the Middle States Association of Colleges and Schools. The college is also approved by the Pennsylvania Department of Education, and the Committee on Professional Training of the American Chemical Society.

### Degrees Offered

Albright College offers the Bachelor of Arts (BA) and Bachelor of Science (BS) degrees.

### Student Success

Albright graduates have exceptional success rates when applying to professional schools, with 92% acceptance rate to dental and veterinary schools and 85% acceptance rate for first time applicants to medical schools and 92% for second time applicants.

### Academic Services

Albright College provides the highest level of support through their faculty Academic Advising system, the Writing Center, and the Academic Learning Center, which offers peer tutoring in a wide range of subjects, academic skills workshops, and academic counseling. The Experiential Learning and Career Development Center (ELCDC) also offers a variety of services, from hands-on academic opportunities to internships, study abroad, service learning, and undergraduate research.

### Special Features

Some of the most popular majors include business, psychology, biology and the sciences, and fashion programs. Albright's interdisciplinary curriculum encourages combined majors and a liberal arts education steeped in real world learning. In addition to their list of majors, the following subjects can be studied as co-majors: Arts Administration; Information Systems; International Relations; Music Business; Optics; Public Health; and Women's & Gender Studies. For those students who are still undecided about a major, the Alpha Program pairs students with a specific faculty advisor to explore courses, subjects and careers to find the right fit.

### Recognition

Albright College is nationally ranked and is named among the top colleges in Pennsylvania for lifetime return on investment.
