Special Features

University of the Ozarks is home to the Jones Learning Center (JLC) on campus, which is a comprehensive fee-based program that provides students with learning disabilities, attention-deficit/hyperactivity disorder (AD/HD) and autism spectrum disorder (ASD) with the skill sets to succeed academically and build brighter futures. The JLC offers more services than any other collegiate program for students with learning disabilities in the nation. Another unique program is Ozarks Outdoors, which offers students the opportunity to obtain leadership skills and personal confidence while experiencing the picturesque nature of Northwest Arkansas.

Academic Services

The LENS Program (Learning Environment for New Synthesis) is University of the Ozarks' new highly

distinctive curriculum that allows students to graduate with an academic major and two minors. The LENS Program challenges students to attain excellence in each of three academic areas, or "lenses" - the humanities, the social sciences, and the natural sciences.

Student Success

90% of graduates employed or enrolled in graduate school within 6 months of graduation.

Recognition

University of the Ozarks was the first college in the nation to establish a program for college students with learning disabilities in 1971. US News & World Report ranks it highly as a Regional College in the South.

University of the Ozarks is a member of the NCAA Division III American Southwest Conference.
